

Map key - Clementine Cove

- 1. St Mary's in the Wood church was built in 1550 on the site of an older, wooden chapel. The chapel had been surrounded by trees and some had to be cut down to make room for the new church.
- 2. Rosehip Cottage the rectory where Reverend Wilfred Parker and his unmarried sister, Rosie (who some of the villagers call, Nosy as in nosy parker) hold monthly get togethers in their sitting room for a 'select few'.
- 3. Sunnycliff Cottage home of Penny Walsh (Hermione Dunmore's sister)
- 4. The new housing estate. It was built 10 years ago but the villagers still refer to the residents as 'newcomers' (and one or two people refer to them as 'The Great Unwashed'. It's meant to be an affectionate term but it's still derogatory)
- 5. Jury's Farm. The Jury family run a Christmas tree farm plus a donkey sanctuary and also keep Llamas, along with a variety of other animals and ducks, chickens and geese, but it was originally an arable farm.
- 6. Judge's Farm. A traditional, sheep farm. The Judge family have no time for the Jurys and their 'farm'.
- 7. Clementine Cottage. Former home of Stanley Talbot, Iris' deceased uncle.
- 8. Clementine Drop. The cliff drops away to the sandy beach, over 50 feet below, but there's access to the beach at each end of the cliff, via natural footpaths, made over centuries of comings and goings.

- 9. Cove Café owned and run by Marian Blythe
- 10. Pinkheart Cottage. Home to Stella Pinkheart. Retired school teacher and general busybody. She and Rosie Parker are, seemingly, good friends, but deep down, their feelings might not be so warm.
- 11. Bayview Manor. Home to Charles and Cordelia King. Cordelia certainly thinks she rules the roost and the village.
- 12. The Bow and Quiver. The village pub owned by Archer Rhodes. His parents sold the pub to him and are now off sailing around the world with the proceeds.
- 13. The Lighthouse. Now a holiday rental, owned by the King family, but the light still functions (on an automatic timer)
- 14. Arrow Point. A rocky promontory on which Archer's pub, The Bow and Quiver is situated.
- 15. Hope Head. Another rocky promontory opposite Arrow Point. This one is steeper and St Mary's in the Wood church sits on this cliff.
